

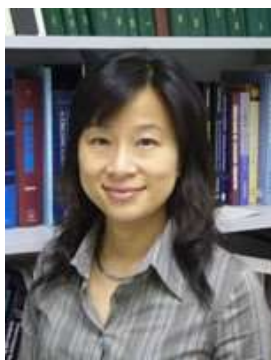
## Science, Christianity, and the Meaning of Success

### Speaker Bios



Dr. Mike Brownutt obtained his first master's degree (MSci in physics) and his PhD (in experimental quantum mechanics) from Imperial College London. Following this he moved to Innsbruck, Austria, for eight years, firstly as a post-doctoral researcher and later as an Assistant Professor, developing scalable architectures for quantum computers. Throughout this work he has had an abiding interest in the relationship between science and religion. He completed his second master's degree (MA in theology from the University of Chester) considering how "faith" is understood in discourse on the relationship between Christianity and science. Now living in Hong Kong, he is Associate Director of the Faith and Science Collaborative Research Forum.



Prof. Chiu obtained her Ph.D. in organic chemistry from the University of Toronto, Canada. She currently carries out research on the development of synthetic methodology and its applications. She is a Fellow of the Royal Society of Chemistry, and on the editorial and advisory boards of several international journals and monographs. She has mentored over 20 PhD candidates. She is currently Associate Head and a Professor in the Department of Chemistry, as well as being the Principal Investigator of the Faith and Science Collaborative Research Forum.
